The vegetable section produced sufficient supply to sustain the entire term, with surplus sold after schools closed. Towards the end of the term, the team had already begun planting vegetables in preparation for Term Three, ensuring a smooth transition into the short term ahead.

Dairy Unit

The dairy unit welcomed two new calves, increasing milk production from 30 litres last term to 40 litres this term. This surplus is currently being sold over the holiday.

Poultry Unit

All laying birds have now been moved to cages, resulting in increased production from 75 trays of eggs per day last season to 106 trays this term, with a target of 125 trays at peak laying.

The piggery continues to be a reliable source of meat for the school. We cur-

Fodder Production

The hay farm has been expanded from four acres to five acres, with the additional acre set to be planted during the upcoming short rains in August.

Other Crops

The farm successfully harvested finger millet, soya, and beans this season, aided by the use of frass fertilizer and organic foliar from the BSF (Black Soldier Fly) unit.

Black Soldier Fly (BSF) Unit

The BSF unit remained a vibrant hub of activity and learning, attracting farmers and visitors from various counties who came for benchmarking and training. Each team received a three-day handson training at our facility, along with starter packs. The unit relocated to a larger facility, positioning us to significantly increase fertilizer and larvae production.

TRAINING & PARTNERSHIPS

Our farm continues to be recognized as a strong learning environment for practical agricultural training. This term, we hosted:

- 3 students from Bukura Agricultural Training College
- 1 student from Bungoma National Polytechnic
- 1 student from Okame Training Institute

These students successfully completed their three-month industrial attachments ending on 15th August. We are already scheduled to host three students from Chamasiri Technical & Vocational College beginning 1st September 2025.

CHALLENGES

- Labour Needs: The expansion of the BSF unit has increased workload significantly.
 With only two staff handling both the unit and greenhouse activities, additional labour is urgently needed.
- Pig Feeds: New feeds introduced for pigs were not well received, forcing us to revert to concentrate feed on a reducing scale until adaptation improves.
- Crop Variety: A poor variety of collard seeds led to rot after one harvest, nearly causing a supply shortage for the school kitchen

CONCLUSION

The Nambale Magnet School continues to stand as a living classroom, a sustainable food source, and a hub of innovation nurturing not only the minds and hearts of our learners, but also uplifting the wider community.
